Career and Technical Education Grant Awarded

Hanover School District has been awarded grant funds for the first time in many years through the federal, Perkins Grant. The grant was written to begin the implementation of trades in the middle and high school grades. Specifically, begin to build the wood working, solar and electric programs.

For this school year the grant funds will purchase a bank of computers and software that will be used by the three programs in the future.

The wood working equipment purchase years ago for the high school is in need of upgrading in order to meet current code. For example, auto shutoff capability should a finger or hand be hit by the blade. An exhaust system is required in the designated space for these three programs.

The grant funds will also allow for staff to be

trained in order to be CTE Certified to teach the necessary courses.

Each year the district will apply for the Perkins Grant funds to help build the wood working, solar and electrical programs.

Proposed Solar Farm Won't Bring In Tax Dollars

A 900-acres solar farm is working through the permitting process. The solar farm is being built by Tradewind Energy. During their presentation to the community they presented the property taxes to be generated for fire, metro, library and school district. But don't be misled.

The way Colorado funds schools is the balance between local property taxes and funding from the state. Each year the state determines, through a formula, how much funding each school district should receive based on the number of students enrolled. The state then subtracts out the amount of local property taxes for education. The state then pays the district the difference.

So when the solar farm states the property taxes for the school district will be approximately \$160,000 that money is not going to the school district. Rather, it is going to the state. Then the state share of what is owed to the school district actually goes down.

For the 2017-18 school year the total amount the school district is to receive from the state is \$3,020,814. The local property taxes collected is approximately \$289,128. The estimate for taxes collected from license plate renewals in our school district boundaries (called specific ownership tax or SOT) is \$85,000. So the state then subtracts out the local property tax and SOT resulting in only sending the district \$2,646,689.

So the \$160,000 additional property tax for the school district actually saves the state. Using the above numbers the state would only have to send the district \$2,486,689.

The Mill Levy Override taxes are extra funds that the state cannot touch. It all stays only with the school district.
